

Explore Potsdam's charming city centre, starting at the historic square Alter Markt, where St. Nicholas' Church, the reconstructed baroque buildings, the Museum Barberini, and the Brandenburg State Parliament in the former city palace set the scene. Strolling through the elegant baroque streets, you will pass Potsdam's lively 'Broadway' before reaching the unique Dutch Quarter. Here, small shops, cafés, and bars create a vibrant, welcoming atmosphere, making it the perfect place to conclude the tour.

Potsdam's Hidden Courtyards

Potsdam captivates not only with the palaces and gardens of its UNESCO World Heritage sites and the picturesque Havel lake landscape. The city also offers a year-round calendar of events that create unforgettable moments. From classical music festivals in historic settings to diverse theatre and cultural festivals in the international art and culture quarter Schiffbauergasse, there is also a remarkable program of events such as the annual Tulip Festival and the Sinterklaas Festival in the Dutch Quarter or the Apple Festival in the Russian Colony Alexandrovka.

Historic Centre: Square Alter Markt, Parliament & the Forgotten Waterway

Once one of the most beautiful squares in Europe, the square Alter Markt has been shining in new splendor for over a decade. Alongside the monumental landmarks of St. Nicholas' Church and the Old Town Hall, historically inspired new buildings such as the Museum Barberini and the Brandenburg State Parliament have been added. Together, they form an impressive ensemble reminiscent of an Italian piazza. After a brief stop at the Film Museum and a glance at the tower of the Garrison Church, the tour concludes at the younger sibling of square Alter Markt – Neuer Markt.

The Telegrafenberg in Potsdam – Where Knowledge meets Research

It is probably the smartest hill in the city: the Telegrafenberg. The story began in 1832 with the construction of an optical telegraph station. The most famous landmark is the Einstein Tower, a solar observatory designed to confirm Einstein's theory of relativity. Today, it lends its name to the Albert Einstein Science Park, home to renowned institutions such as the German Research Centre for Geosciences, the Leibniz Institute for Astrophysics and the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research. Not only a hub of cutting-edge science, Telegrafenberg is also worth a visit for its remarkable architecture.

Attention: Border ahead! The area between the Glienicke Bridge and the Meierei in the New Garden is one of the most popular excursion destinations in Potsdam. Today, this UNESCO World Heritage site shows little trace of the fact that until 1990, it marked the border between the GDR and West Berlin. Warning. Restricted Zone! Along the Potsdam Border Strip

Nobody has any intention of building a wall! And yet, it came - and divided Germany. In what is now a UNESCO World Heritage site, history was made during the Potsdam Conference. The former border fortifications once shaped the cityscape on the outskirts of Potsdam. This guided tour takes you on a fascinating journey through Cold War-era Potsdam. You will hear moving stories of border crossers and secret agents. The route leads from Glienicke Bridge, the "Bridge of Spies", along the former inner-German border to the checkpoint at Bertini-Enge.

Babelsberg – Movie Stars, Mansions, World History

Potsdam's Mansion Colony Neubabelsberg, situated along the shores of Lake Griebnitzsee, has fascinating stories to unfold. Once home to wealthy industrialists and bankers, the neighborhood also attracted film stars such as Brigitte Horney and Marika Rökk. The renowned architect Mies van der Rohe built one of his first houses here, while writer Erich Kästner found refuge during the Nazi era. In 1945, U.S. President Truman resided here during the Potsdam Conference, where he made far-reaching decisions that shaped the post-war world.

And Action! The Film Location Potsdam

Potsdam is Germany's only UNESCO Creative City of Film. This tour, designed for cinephiles and film enthusiasts, takes you to the original locations and film sets in the historic centre. Alongside fascinating stories about film and television productions, a Potsdam expert offers insight into the city's captivating film history. The tour concludes in the foyer of the Film Museum, where you can visit the permanent exhibition "Dream Factory - 100 Years of Film in Babelsberg" afterward.

Bike Tour "Alter Fritz" - Our Classic

Follow in the footsteps of Frederick the Second on a cycling tour to Potsdam's most iconic sights. Pedal your way from the square Alter Markt to the world-famous Sanssouci Park, where you can feel the longing of Prussian rulers for Italy. Equally magnificent is the New Garden. From the Marble House, enjoy one of the most stunning vistas over the lake Heiliger See, all the way to Peacock Island. The tour continues through the New Garden and back to Potsdam's baroque city centre and the Dutch Quarter.

Potsdam at Second Glance - Celebrities, Film and Agent Exchange

The route takes you through the noble Mansion Colony Neubabelsberg along lake Griebnitzsee, past grand estates. Once home to famous personalities such as Hans Albers and Marika Rökk, it also hosted President Harry S. Truman during the Potsdam Conference. At a leisurely pace, continue through the former GDR enclave of Klein Glienicke to the Glienicke Bridge, which once symbolized the division of East and West Germany. From there, the tour leads through the New Garden, into the "Forbidden City" and then back to the city centre.



The art of filmmaking is as much part of Potsdam's DNA as Sanssouci is to Frederick the Second. This cycling tour takes film enthusiasts to key movie locations in Potsdam. Ride through the Mansion Colony Neubabelsberg, where film stars once stayed during shoots at the nearby studios. Continue across the "Bridge of Spies" to the Dutch Quarter, often used as a backdrop for scenes set in Amsterdam. After the tour, a visit to the Film Museum is a must, offering rich stories from UFA, DEFA, and the past three decades of the film industry.

Significant Gardeners

Johann Moritz von Nassau-Siegen said of the island of Potsdam: "The entire island must become a paradise." This vision is still alive today. Immerse yourself in the green idyll of Potsdam: From the island Freundschaftsinsel cycle along the Havel to Glienicke Bridge. From there, enjoy a stunning view of the Babelsberg Park, shaped by Prince Pückler. The tour then takes you through the New Garden and past the fruit trees of the Russian Colony Alexandrovka. It continues to the Karl Foerster Garden in Potsdam-Bornim, where the famous gardener and perennial breeder once lived and worked. After a short break, return back to the city centre through Sanssouci Park, designed by Peter Joseph Lenné.

Get on your bike and immerse yourself in the natural beauty of Potsdam and its surroundings. With its well-developed network of bike paths, the region offers an ideal setting for cycling tours, allowing visitors to explore the landscapes shaped by the river Havel and its lakes. Idyllic spots along the route invite you to pause and take in the view.

Potsdam is the ideal starting point for the F1 Cycle Path, which spans 34 kilometers through the scenic lake district, combining natural beauty and cultural heritage. Charming villages, historic palaces and manor houses as well as quaint cafés are waiting to be discovered.

Idyllic Potsdam

Embark on a cycling tour through Potsdam's beautifully designed gardens and scenic lake landscape. Start at square Alter Markt, ride through the Dutch Quarter and beneath the apple trees of the Russian Colony Alexandrovka and continue up to the Belvedere on the Pfingstberg, where clear days offer stunning views reaching all the way to Berlin.

The return journey follows the Havel riverbank through the New Garden, crosses the Glienicke Bridge, once marking the inner-German border, and winds through Babelsberg Park before leading back to square Alter Markt.



City Tour "The Best of Potsdam"

The tour leads through historic Potsdam and its charming districts all the way to the Glienicke Bridge, offering open views of the bustling boat traffic on the Havel and the gently sloping landscape of Babelsberg Park. City Tours with a Historic Tram

All aboard for a ride full of charm! A city tour by historic tram is a truly special experience. The vehicles themselves are a highlight: from the Lindner motorcar of the imperial era to the rounded Gotha trams of the 1960s and the angular Tatra tram of 1972. Potsdam's tram network is perfect for sightseeing, passing by the city's historic landmarks.

Sit back and take in views of the City Palace, the Dutch Quarter, the Russian Colony Alexandrovka, the Old Town of the Soldier King and the grand buildings of Frederick the Second. The tour also includes former military areas that have been transformed into modern districts in the north of the city, as well as Babelsberg. And of course, no ride would be complete without passing through the gate Nauener Tor.

Step aboard! Conductor Robert Leichsenring, dressed in a historic uniform, accompanies each tour. Along the way, he shares amusing and locally inspired stories about the many sights—because in Potsdam, there's always plenty to see.



Nestled between lake Heiliger See and lake Jungfernsee, just below Pfingstberg, lies the New Garden. This park is home to remarkable architectural treasures, including the Marble House, the Orangery, the Dutch Houses, the Shingle House and the Gothic Library. The New Garden is also a site of great historical significance: Cecilienhof Palace, where the Potsdam Conference took place in 1945.

Please note that Cecilienhof Palace has been closed for renovation work since 1 November 2024. As an alternative, we recommend an interior tour of the Marble House, the summer residence of King Frederick William II.

Park Idyll - The New Garden

The New Garden attracts countless visitors each year, not least for its historical significance as the site of the Potsdam Conference, where world history was shaped at Cecilienhof Palace after World War II. Beyond the famous palace, built in the style of an English country house, the park features sweeping meadows along Lake Heiliger See, offering stunning sightlines and fascinating stories about Potsdam and beyond.

For Karl Foerster, the perennial garden was the garden of the future. The flowering garden introduced a new concept in landscaping, placing plants at its very heart.

Karl Foerster's pioneering approach to garden design lives on in Potsdam and beyond, extending its influence as far as the US and Japan. Visitors can experience his legacy at his former home and garden in Potsdam-Bornim or on island Freundschaftsinsel, just steps from the main train station.

After his death, Foerster was honored with a monument on island Freundschaftsinsel. The sculpture bears an inscription with a quote from the garden philosopher: 'Those who seek to bring their dreams to life must be more awake and dream deeper than others!'"

Potsdam's Green Gems Between Square Alter Markt and the Havel

While much has changed around square Alter Markt over the past 100 years, two green oases remain: the magnificent Lustgarten and the idyllic island Freundschaftsinsel.
